Hitachi Announces the Merger of Hitachi Information & Communication Engineering and Hitachi Computer Peripherals

- Establishment of One of Japan's Largest ICT System Engineering Operating Companies -

Tokyo, October 1, 2012 – Hitachi, Ltd. (TSE: 6501) today announced that its subsidiaries Hitachi Information & Communication Engineering and Hitachi Computer Peripherals, which comprise its Information & Telecommunication Systems Company, agreed to merge on April 1, 2013.

Hitachi Information & Communication Engineering and Hitachi Computer Peripherals fulfill core roles as engineering operating companies in the platform business of Hitachi's Information & Telecommunication Systems Company. The two companies mainly provide product design, development, manufacturing, evaluation and verification and related solutions, with Hitachi Information & Communication Engineering focusing mainly on servers and communications network equipment, and Hitachi Computer Peripherals focusing on storage products. Through this merger, the two companies will hone their design and development capabilities by achieving a dynamic development structure through the centralization and sharing of development resources such as equipment design, LSI design and embedded software. Leveraging these enhancement capabilities, both companies will work to expand the platform business and sharpen their competitiveness globally.

In recent years, the business environment surrounding IT has experienced drastic changes driven by trends such as the heightened importance of integrated platforms that seek to integrate servers, storage and operating systems to reduce the burden of systems integration, operation and management and the heightend importance of much faster and more highly reliable network systems. Other trends are the emergence of new service platforms such as cloud computing. Furthermore, needs related to IT systems are becoming increasingly diverse due to such factors as the globalization of business and the growing complexity of business models.

Hitachi is globally developing the Social Innovation Business, which provides advanced social infrastructure linked by IT, with the aim of driving further growth. As part of this, Hitachi is working to strengthen the Information & Telecommunication

Systems business as one of the core operation of the Social Innovation Business. In the Information & Telecommunication Systems business, Hitachi has positioned three areas as core business fields: highly reliable cloud computing services, smart information and Big Data. On April 1, 2012, Hitachi integrated and reorganized divisions related to servers, storage, and communications networks, as well as cloud business, with the view to providing integrated platform solutions supporting the three core business fields. Through these measures, Hitachi is building a platform business structure that can rapidly address changes in the IT environment and diversifying needs ahead of competitors.

Hitachi is conducting the merger of Hitachi Information & Communication Engineering and Hitachi Computer Peripherals as part of these measures to strengthen business, and believes that the merger will further enhance the organizational structure of the Information & Telecommunications Systems business and contribute to expansion of the platform business. Going forward, the new company will fuse the two companies' strengths, namely their core technologies and know-how, with the aim of becoming the No.1 engineering operating company in the information & telecommunication systems field.
